Research Award Opportunities!

Norma J. Lang Prize

The Norma J. Lang Prize for Undergraduate Information Research recognizes undergraduate students whose research projects make extensive use of UC Davis Library resources, services and expertise and advance the students' understanding of the academic research process. First, second and third-place prizes will be awarded every year in these disciplines: arts, humanities & social sciences and science, engineering & math. Applications are due by **Monday, April 9, 2018 at 11:00pm**.

Chancellor's Award for Excellence in Undergraduate Research (Dean Keith Simonton Prize)

The Chancellor's Award for Excellence in Undergraduate Research, coupled with the Dean Keith Simonton Prize, is an annual award instituted in 1994. The award recognizes outstanding undergraduate students for their research, scholarship or creative activity tied to any academic subject and performed while at UC Davis. Each year up to two graduating seniors who have completed outstanding research, scholarship or creative activity tied to any academic subject while at UC Davis are awarded the Chancellor's Award for Excellence in Undergraduate Research. The award will be announced and a special plaque and \$500 will be awarded at the Chancellor's Award Reception in June.

Applications are due by **Wednesday, April 11, 2018 at 5:00pm**.

Undergraduate Travel Awards

The Undergraduate Research Center administers undergraduate travel awards for up to \$500 to students who travel to present at undergraduate research conferences and meetings of regionally or internationally recognized professional societies (or discipline specific equivalent—e.g. performance at nationally recognized festivals) to present their research.

Applications are due by **Monday, April 16, 2018 at 5:00pm**.

Provost's Undergraduate Fellowship (PUF)

The Provost's Undergraduate Fellowship (PUF) supports undergraduate students doing research or creative projects under the guidance of UC Davis faculty members. Students from all discipline areas are eligible to apply. Past projects have involved laboratory research, field studies, survey research, film production, design and creation of art elements, music composition, fine arts performances, travel to library or research collections, and many other endeavors. Group projects are not appropriate, however, separate (but linked) projects may be considered. The maximum award is \$1,800 toward approved costs directly related to the project.

Applications (for projects carried out in Summer/Fall 2018) are due by **Monday, April 16, 2018 at 5:00pm**.
